Dear Mayor Walker:

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that officials from the Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Region IX Office recently met with Ventura County Watershed Protection District and City of Fillmore staff to review the new Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) for the County. During this meeting, it was agreed that the new FIRM will be issued as scheduled on January 20, 2010, and that FEMA will issue a Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) to your office on January 21, 2010 that will revise the new FIRM for portions of the City of Fillmore, to reflect the flood risk information shown on the currently effective FIRM. This LOMR will impact map panels 06111C0640E, 0641E, 0643E, and 0644E for the City of Fillmore and will have the effect of revising the new FIRM without reprinting the affected map panels.

The revision will be accomplished by removing the Special Flood Hazard Areas identified in the ongoing Santa Clara River flood study and extending the Provisionally Accredited Levee (PAL) status of the SC-1 levee (FEMA levee ID 46) along Sespe Creek to include the SC-2 levee (FEMA levee ID 101). The SCR-5 levee (FEMA levee ID 114) along the Santa Clara River will also be shown as a PAL. The LOMR will show the areas that are protected from the 1%-annual-chance flood event by these levees as moderate risk areas, designated as Zone X (shaded). The boundaries of these areas will be based on the currently effective 1%-annual-chance flow rates for Sespe Creek and the Santa Clara River.

When the Santa Clara River flood study is completed in approximately 30 months, revised FIRM panels for affected portions of the City of Fillmore will be issued to reflect the results of the study. This future revision will incorporate the results of FEMA's review of all certification data and documentation submitted by the Ventura County Watershed Protection District for the levees impacting the City of Fillmore. Levees that are in full compliance with the National Flood Insurance Program regulations cited at Title 44, Chapter 1, Section 65.10 of the Code of Federal Regulations (44 CFR 65.10) will be accredited on the revised FIRM panels. Levees that are not in full compliance with 44 CFR 65.10 will be de-accredited.

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We will continue to work with the Ventura County Water Protection District as the Santa Clara River flood study progresses, and the future FIRM revisions are produced to reflect the flood risk for the City of Fillmore.
