Fillmore Towne Theatre started their first weekend with new lower prices and new days of operation. There were 95 people in attendance at the theatre last weekend. This attendance is higher than normal; however, it may be due to the popular movie that was shown. Staff will continue to monitor the attendance.

Preparing for the 2010/2011 Recreation Youth Basketball Season; registration will begin Monday, October 4<sup>th</sup>.

## **Finance**

### **Current Projects/Issues:**

Finance staff is working on day to day assignments, utility billing, accounts receivable, utility billing, accounts payable and payroll. Finance staff is also working on year end issues for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2010.

Finance has completed inputting the 2010-2011 budget information into the computer and is now working on inputting the budget adjustments for fiscal year 2009-2010. We are also updating the budget before it is printed to add a column for Actual Year To Date for FY 2009/10.

We are also in the process of holding a Proposition 218 Hearing for the Sewer and Water Rates. The actual hearing is scheduled for September 14.

The water refunding has been placed on hold until the City can conduct the 218 Hearing on the Water Rates. It has become very clear that a water rate increase will be needed in 2010-11 to provide the required income to support the water operation and the coverage needed for the debt service. It should further be added that the sewer fund is also having difficulty meeting its bond covenants and that a sewer rate increase will be required.

## **Fire Department**

### **Calls:**

Fire Department ran 25 calls: Medical - 17, Traffic Collisions - 3 (3 vehicle Traffic Collisions with four injured people; Simi Truck trailer into guard rail in front of El Dorado, 100 gallon diesel spill was handed over to Caltrans with Environmental Health notified; clean up is complete and is guard rail repaired), Fires - 1 (Vehicle and Large Palm Tree – Fourth & Mountain View), Alarms - 1, Public Service - 1 and Investigation - 2

### **Current Projects:**

All systems are normal for the Fire Department. Staffing has been a bit light this week although in town volunteers have really stepped up and responded to calls. All went well with Quint 91's participation in the Point Mugu Air Show. Chief John Adkins was very appreciative of the mutual aide we provided for their event.

We are having a small mechanical problem with the pump panel and throttle control on E91, steps are being taken to address the issue.

We are currently in the process of evaluating SCBA (Self Contained Breathing Apparatus) Manufacturers, as we have been awarded a County-wide agency grant. Scott, Sperian, Interspiro, and Drager have all demonstrated their products. A Fire Department committee has been formed for the evaluation.

#### **Planning Applications:**

The Entitlements for Super A Foods expansion of their bakery into the adjacent building has been approved and the Construction Plans have been submitted for plan check.

**Public Works**

**Paving A Street & Mountain View:** The grinding started on Thursday, August 12<sup>th</sup>, the rubberized interlayer will be installed on Monday, August 16<sup>th</sup> and the rubberized asphalt paved on Tuesday, August 17<sup>th</sup>. This project is funded 100% by Federal Stimulus monies. Mountain View will be paved from Hwy 126 to 2<sup>nd</sup> Street and A Street will be paved from Santa Clara to Sespe Avenue.

**Well #9:** The drilling contractor has begun to set up to drill Well #9. He is bringing in his drilling equipment and setting up a sound dampening wall. Drilling is scheduled to begin on Monday,

August 23<sup>rd</sup> and will proceed 24 hours a day for up to 3 weeks. The drilling cannot stop because there is a high risk of the well collapsing due to the cobbled nature of the Sespe formation.

Public Works: Staff replaced an 8 inch and 6 inch valve in Hume Drive because they broke shut. Regular maintenance was performed this week on the emergency generators at the water wells. Trimmed the palm trees around high school so the seed pods would not be a tripping hazard and the work could be done before school starts next week.

Sespe Creek Levee: Ventura County Watershed Protection District has awarded a \$900,000 design contract to PACE Engineering to do the preliminary analysis and then the actual design of improvements necessary to recertify the levee with FEMA. Surveyors were out this week on the levee gathering topography. PACE is currently analyzing the foundation of the levee to determine if it must be retrofitted. This answer may not be known for a few months. The magnitude of the raising of the levee is still about 6-feet high near Sespe Avenue and tapering to zero at Shiells Park and Blue Jay Street.
