City Seeking Applicants for Two Seats on City Public Arts Commission

Persons interested in serving on the City of Fillmore Public Arts Commission are invited to submit an application as soon as possible. This will be open until filled.

The City Council appointed three candidates to the newly formed Public Arts Commission and still has two vacant seats. The Arts Commission will serve as an advisory body to the City Council. The Commission will encourage, stimulate, promote and foster the cultural enrichment of the City, and thereby contribute to the quality of life in the City and develop awareness in the business community, in local government and in the general public of the value of the arts in the City.

The Commission does not yet have policies or a specified meeting time and place. The members appointed will be appointed to terms of up to four years, with the terms of members staggered so that no more than two terms shall expire in any one year. All scheduled and special meetings of the Commission shall be publicly announced, open to the public, agendaized and administered in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act.
